1. The Board began its public consultation on its agenda-setting process in 2011 by publishing a request for views *Agenda Consultation 2011* (the RFV). The preliminary analysis of responses received was discussed at the January Board meeting. In addition, both the Board and staff have taken part in over 80 outreach activities and have sought input from a range of sources. The output from this process will be a feedback statement and a strategy document.
